	must not be modified or have been subjected to mechanical or chemical treatment (other than						
	normal cleaning) in any way.						
	b. If the Judge of Fact reports that the front fairing on one or more karts was no longer in the						
	correct position when the "black and white chequered flag" was displayed and the Kart(s)						







	concerned crossed the finish line, in all situations a penalty will be imposed automatically on the driver(s) concerned.						
	c. This penalty is not susceptible to protest or appeal.						
	d. Should a Driver be found/proved to have intentionally replaced or attempted to replace a front fairing						
	which is not installed correctly during the Race or after the "black and white chequered flag" was displayed they will be Disqualified from the Meeting.						
	EXITING KART POST RACE









Appendix 1 - Front Fairing Installation
